# **Payment and Scheduling Policies**

- 1. **Monthly Payment Policy**: If one chooses to provide monthly payments, these are charged a month in advance (ex. May 31<sup>st</sup> pays for the month of June). Payments are typically charged over a four-week period.
  - a. All payments are to be made either through Venmo (@Tyler-Goodwin-15) or via check. The payment needs to be paid prior to the first lesson of the month.
  - b. In the event of a five-week month, there will not be an additional charge for the extra week. This may change if the following month only has three weeks, but this will be consulted prior to payment.
  - c. In the event of a student beginning in the middle of the month, a prorated amount will be initiated at the beginning of the contract and will be kept on file in case of financial discrepancies.

- d. If a student and/or parent/guardian would like materials to be purchased and mailed to the student. Those charges can and will be added to the following monthly bill and notated on the invoice.
- 2. **Discount Policy**: For longevity of student enrollment or in seasonal promotions, a discount can be put in place for students and/or parent guardian.
  - a. **Seasonal Discounts**: These are notated on the studio website (www.thgoodwinhorn.com) or on social media platforms (Facebook and Instagram).
  - b. **Bring a Friend Policy**: If a student recommends a new student to the studio an additional 10% discount will be given to the current and new student upon enrollment. This application is only given to both parties enrolling. This promotion can stack over the course of the lessons contract, but discounts are only applied once per month.
    - i. Legacy members will be able to add this policy to their legacy discount.
  - c. **Legacy Discount**: If a student has been enrolled in lessons for more than one year, an additional \$5 per month (or \$1 per singular lesson) will be applied and can stack over the duration of time (ex. 5 years of lessons with equivalate to \$25 off monthly or \$5 off per lesson).
    - i. This is also enacted for those with additional family members who have studied with the teacher for multiple years. For those enrolled with Pecknel Music Studios of Goodwin Studios between May 2016-January 2020 with Tyler H. Goodwin-Souffront, this policy does apply.
    - ii. The Bring a Friend Policy will add an additional discount the Bring a Friend policy first and then the Legacy Discount in addition.
- 3. **Scheduling Policy**: A monthly schedule will be provided on the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month.
  - a. In the event of a scheduling conflict or change of the teacher the students and/or parent(s)/guardian(s) will be notified well in advance of the conflict. If the teacher needs to reschedule due to personal conflict, all parties will be notified within two weeks in advance of the conflict.
    - i. If the teacher does not notify all parties within the agreed time, and one would like a refund or credit for the following month, that will be honored.
  - b. If a student does not show up for a lesson, an email will be sent to the student and/or parent guardian within 5-10 minutes of the assigned lesson time. If the student does not appear at least three times over the course of the term without prior notice, a termination policy can be put into effect.
- 4. **Reschedule Policy**: In the case of a rescheduled lesson, it is the responsibility of the parent/guardian and/or student to contact the teacher within 2-7 days of the scheduling change.
  - a. Not all reschedules will be guaranteed, so the further in advance the teacher is notified, the easier the change in schedule will be granted.
  - b. If a parent/guardian and/or student would like to change their lesson day and/or time, please follow the guidelines of the main reschedule policy.
- 5. Cancellation Policy: In the case of a cancellation, it is the responsibility of the parent/guardian and/or student to contact the teacher within 24 hours of the lesson cancellation.

- a. **Monthly Payments Only**: If the cancellation does not follow under the given time frame there will not be a credit issued to the account.
- 6. **Lesson Materials Policy**: It is the responsibility of the student and/or parent/guardian to have all necessary materials for each lesson (books, music stand, oils, pencil, etc.)
  - a. Students, parents and/or guardians are encouraged to order their lesson materials as soon as possible upon first mention.
    - i. If there is a delay on orders for materials (specifically music), please send a receipt with proof of purchase and a digital copy will be provided by the teacher. It is under the agreements of copyright law that all music must be purchased and owned by the student and/or parent/guardian. Violation of this policy can come in terms of termination of the contract by the teacher.
    - ii. If needed, the parent/guardian and/or student would like the teacher to order materials to have sent to their home, this is possible, but will be needed to be notified by the teacher as soon as possible. The payment for these materials will be added to the next lesson/monthly payment and will be notated on the invoice.
- 7. **Preparation Policy**: All students are expected to prepare their lesson materials each week upon arrival. Students are expected to practice the length of their lesson times for five days each week (see below).
  - a. There are cases when students are busy and do not have a lot of time to prepare for lessons. There is a one week per month forgiveness in place, but the student and/or parent guardian will be notified.
  - b. Second offenses will result in the student and/or parent/guardian to be notified. Students will then record a practice log that will be signed by the parent/guardian in addition to **two** recordings of practice materials to a pre-assigned Google Drive folder.
  - c. Three or more offenses can result in a termination policy by the teacher (see below).
- 8. **Termination Policy**: In case of violations of any policies and/or agreements of the contract signed by the teacher, student, and/or parent guardian a termination policy can be put into place at any point.
  - a. **Teacher Termination**: The teacher has the right to end the contract at any point in time if they see fit. The reasons for termination by the teacher can be notated as follows:
    - i. Violation of the scheduling policy with three or more unexcused absences over the course of the term.
    - ii. Violation of copyright laws and/or proper ownership of lesson materials.
    - iii. Violation of the preparation policy.
    - iv. An unexpected and unforeseen circumstance where the teacher is no longer available to fulfill their duties. This will be notified to all students, parents and/or guardians immediately.
      - 1. If for reason this comes into effect, the teacher will do their best to have a transfer of studio available for the student and/or parent/guardian to ensure continued musical success.
      - 2. A transfer of studio will not be in place if a student violates any of the prior policies listed above.

- b. **End of Contract**: If a student and/or parent/guardian wishes to end lessons, they are willing to do so at any point.
  - i. Please note the scheduling, rescheduling and cancellation policies for refunds in payment. These policies still imply.
- 9. **Renewal Policy**: Near the end of the term, a new contract for the upcoming term will be sent to the student and/or parent/guardian two weeks prior to the new term (for **Summer 2023** this will be the week of **July 17-22**, **2023** for the **Fall 2023** term). New payment options, changes in lesson type and formatting will be notified in the new contract. This is in place in case of record of continued lesson, promotional discounts, etc.

## **Lesson Formatting**

- 1. **Beginning Students (30 minutes)**: Our goal for the summer term is to get you started on your instrument! Congratulations on starting your musical journey! A couple of things to keep in mind while we get started. It will be a slow process at first and then we'll get moving rather quickly.
  - a. **Start-Up**: The beginning of the lesson process will begin over the course of three weeks. Parent(s)/Guardian(s) are welcome to attend these lessons in order to understand and encourage these basic principles covered.
    - i. Week 1: Breathing (no instrument needed yet) we're going to get to know each other a little bit first, and then talk about the importance of breathing. Students are encouraged to practice breathing exercises sparingly to build good habits.
    - ii. Week 2: Mouthpiece buzzing (Bring instrument) we're going to review our breathing exercises and then begin learning how to make a beautiful buzz on the mouthpiece. Students are now encouraged to practice buzzing throughout the day for between 15-30 minutes over the course of this week.
    - iii. Week 3: Instrument Day! (Bring instrument) we're going to review all lesson materials from the previous two weeks and then we're going to practice putting together and learning how to hold the instrument. We'll also cover basic maintenance and care. We'll learn a couple of starting notes. Students are encouraged to practice 20-30 minutes a day to build good habits and familiarity.
    - iv. Week 4: Lesson takeoff! (Bring instrument) now we're going to hit the ground running! We'll review all materials from the previous three weeks and then we'll begin working on lesson materials (see below).
  - b. **Lessons**: For beginning students, students will cover the following things in each lesson:
    - i. **Breathing** This will be taken off once students build good habits.
    - ii. Fundamentals Exercises will be provided by the teacher.
    - iii. **Weekly Homework Assignments** These will be provided by the teacher each week. Students are assigned 5-7 short etudes from their band book each week.
    - iv. **Sightreading** If a student excels and passes all their assigned etudes, we will get ahead in the book and practice sight-reading skills.

- v. **Assign Future Homework** At the end of the lesson, while the student is packing up, assignments for the following week will be given. This is done in the last 1-2 minutes of the lesson.
- c. **Practicing**: Students are encouraged to practice the length of their lessons up to five days a week (30 minutes 150 minutes weekly minimum). I do encourage students to take a break since we are building up muscles, but it is encouraged not to take breaks before lesson days. Students are given homework assignments each week to practice. If a student is unprepared for one week, there is a pass (see practice record policy). If a student is unprepared for two weeks or more, students are encouraged to fill out a practice sheet and record (see practice record policy). If a student continues to show up to lessons unprepared by the course of the month, the teacher does have the right to dismiss the student at any point (please see practice record and refund policy).

#### 2. Middle School/Early Adult Students (30 minutes)

- a. **Lessons**: For earlier students, students will cover the following things in each lesson:
  - i. **Fundamentals** Exercises will be provided by the teacher.
  - ii. **Weekly Homework Assignments** These will be provided by the teacher each week. Students are assigned 5-7 short etudes from their band book each week.
  - iii. **Sightreading** If a student excels and passes all their assigned etudes, we will get ahead in the book and practice sight-reading skills.
  - iv. **Assign Future Homework** At the end of the lesson, while the student is packing up, assignments for the following week will be given. This is done in the last 1-2 minutes of the lesson.
- b. **Practicing**: Students are encouraged to practice the length of their lessons up to five days a week (30 minutes 150 minutes weekly minimum). I do encourage students to take a break since we are building up muscles, but it is encouraged not to take breaks before lesson days. Students are given homework assignments each week to practice. If a student is unprepared for one week, there is a pass (see practice record policy). If a student is unprepared for two weeks or more, students are encouraged to fill out a practice sheet and record (see practice record policy). If a student continues to show up to lessons unprepared by the course of the month, the teacher does have the right to dismiss the student at any point (please see practice record and refund policy).

### 3. Middle School/Adult Students (45 minutes)

- a. This format of lessons is only given to students in 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> grade (or adults) who have shown promise in their skills and preparation. These are only given at the beginning of new terms in agreement to the student and/or parent/guardian.
- b. **Lessons**: For intermediate students, students will cover the following things in each lesson:
  - i. **Fundamentals** Exercises will be provided by the teacher.
  - ii. **Weekly Homework Assignments** These will be provided by the teacher each week. Students are assigned 5-7 short etudes from their band book each week.

- iii. **Sightreading** If a student excels and passes all their assigned etudes, we will get ahead in the book and practice sight-reading skills.
- iv. **Assign Future Homework** At the end of the lesson, while the student is packing up, assignments for the following week will be given. This is done in the last 1-2 minutes of the lesson.
- c. **Practicing**: Students are encouraged to practice the length of their lessons up to five days a week (45 minutes 225 minutes weekly minimum). I do encourage students to take a break since we are building up muscles, but it is encouraged not to take breaks before lesson days. Students are given homework assignments each week to practice. If a student is unprepared for one week, there is a pass (see practice record policy). If a student is unprepared for two weeks or more, students are encouraged to fill out a practice sheet and record (see practice record policy). If a student continues to show up to lessons unprepared by the course of the month, the teacher does have the right to dismiss the student at any point (please see practice record and refund policy).

#### 4. High School/College/Adult Students (60 minutes)

- a. **Lessons**: For advanced students, students will cover the following things in each lesson:
  - i. **Fundamentals** Exercises will be provided by the teacher.
  - ii. Weekly Homework Assignments These will be provided by the teacher each week. Students will be presented with materials that will be notated weekly. It is the student's responsibility to have all lesson materials prepared and owned.
  - iii. **Sightreading** If a student excels and passes all their assigned etudes, we will get ahead in the book and practice sight-reading skills.
  - iv. **Assign Future Homework** At the end of the lesson, while the student is packing up, assignments for the following week will be given. This is done in the last 1-2 minutes of the lesson.
- b. **Practicing**: Students are encouraged to practice the length of their lessons up to five days a week (60 minutes 300 minutes weekly minimum). I do encourage students to take a break since we are building up muscles, but it is encouraged not to take breaks before lesson days. Students are given homework assignments each week to practice. If a student is unprepared for one week, there is a pass (see practice record policy). If a student is unprepared for two weeks or more, students are encouraged to fill out a practice sheet and record (see practice record policy). If a student continues to show up to lessons unprepared by the course of the month, the teacher does have the right to dismiss the student at any point (please see practice record and refund policy).
